Cost

Case Study: 2021 Most Inspiring Women in Cyber Awards

- 89 individuals registered for the physical event, with 69 in attendance.
- 24 individuals attended via Zoom at its peak.
- 78 total nominations came through, with 58 nominations completed and selected for the shortlist.
- Top 21 women selected as the most inspiring by our esteemed panel of judges.
- Jenny Radcliffe attended as keynote speaker, with 3,202 views via Linkedin Live and 129 likes (as of 07.12.21).
- £400 raised for NSPCC.
- 5,960 views of MIWIC IT Security Guru page (as of 8th December 2021)
- 3,490 views on feature articles, averaging 166 views per article. 2,957 were unique views.
- 5,352 views of nominee shortlist articles and Top 21 announcement article (as of 8th December). 4,269 were unique views.
- Almost 42,000 impressions on Twitter solely from posts published on the IT Security Guru page.
